Sports Review

On September 30th, Class 5 went to play short mat bowls at North Duffield Village Hall. It was great, we learnt lots of new skills and we hope to do it again.

On Monday 1st October the Sports Ambassadors from North Duffield School, went to Chapel Haddlesey to learn games that they could play back at school. They made up two games: number splat and number chase. They are now playing these games with KS1 at lunch times.

On the 9th October, the cross-country runners went to Selby College for the Selby district final. One runner got through to the North Yorkshire final at Dalby Forest. On the 17th October the North Duffield School football team played a home match against Cliffe in the semi-finals of the Small School's Cup. North Duffield won 6-3 and will now face Barkston Ash in the final.

On 21st October twelve Year 3s and 4s went to play a Quicksticks hockey tournament at Riccall. Each team played three games and tried so hard: the children came 4th and 6th.

North Duffield learnt how to play Quidditch on the 23rd October. At the start of the day we had an assembly where the sorting hat decided which Hogwart's house the teams would be in. Each class had around fifty minutes to play. It was really fun!





Outdoor Gym

The children have been getting plenty of exercise this term after the unveiling of our fantastic new outdoor gym, installed by local company Pioneer Play. The exciting range of equipment includes health walkers, a slalom skier, sit up benches, a strength challenger, a horse rider, a rower and an interactive 'boot camp' board complete with a giant solar panel stopwatch.

The gym, supplied by Sovereign Play, is designed to develop aerobic fitness and physical wellbeing and is proving to be a real hit. The school's Sports Council members led training sessions with each class on how to use the different stations safely and effectively and now the children are lining up to have a go at breaktimes!

This is such a great asset for a small village school like ours, providing outdoor play opportunities not only keeps the children fit and healthy but helps to boost their personal, social and emotional development, all whilst having fun.





Educational Visits



Class 3 had a fun day at the Egyptian Museum in Hull, supporting their current topic on Ancient Egypt. They looked at artefacts, which included a real mummy and a coffin donated by a local businessman. They got hands on experience mummifying a child and an apple (the child was more fun to do!). They also got to make paper from real reeds from the River Nile and wrote in hieroglyphics. It was an amazing, action packed day.



Class 4 had an utterly incredible day exploring the World Heritage Site Housesteads Roman Fort, part of Hadrian's Wall, where they discovered life as a Roman soldier. They spent time interacting with and examining the Roman site in detail, including the barracks, (and communal latrines!) before climbing up the escarpment to the hypocaust. We were so proud of them all for completing such a challenging hike and witnessed all four of our metacognition learning behaviours in action throughout the day - resilience, reflectiveness, reciprocity and resourcefulness!



Project Wild visited school to talk to the children about wildlife, food chains, lifecycles, habitats and how animals adapt to their environment. Each class had the opportunity to learn about and handle a grass snake, slow worm, tarantula and giant stick insect.

Food Survey

We have been running our own catering service in school for over a year. As part of our review we felt we would like to know what parents think about our menu. We had a number of responses, many positive and with some suggestions that we have taken on board. You will be receiving a new menu for next half term, we have tried to incorporate some of your ideas alongside some of the children's. If you have any comments please let us know.



Harvest Festival

Our KS1 Harvest assembly had a flying start with our EYFS children singing about the Little Red Hen, followed by Year 1's fabulous retelling of the story which included some very dramatic actions. Our Year 2's impressed us with their groovy Harvest rap, complete with caps, cool sunglasses and some rather interesting dance moves! KS2 focused on the journey of food and the carbon footprint of producing a simple sandwich. Songs included 5-a-Day and Give Thanks to the Harvest. Well done to all of our children, you made us very proud indeed. All food donations have gone to Selby & District Food Bank.

We thoroughly enjoyed welcoming the parents and grandparents of Class 1 to join us for a roast dinner. The children did an excellent job of making place cards and showing their relatives how to line up nicely.
