Science - Sink or float?	Science – Observing overtime
Get a large container (eg a bowl or plastic box), fill it with water, then collect a range of 5 objects (or more) from around the house.	Plant seeds into separate pots. Put these pots into different areas in and around your house, for example; in the cupboard, by the window, outside, in the fridge etc.
For each object please estimate whether it will sink or float before dropping it in the water. Write down what you thought/estimated and what actually happened. How did you do overall?	Make sure each pot is watered and after a few weeks write down your outcome. Which pot sprouted first? Which one sprouted last if they did? Which area was best to grow your plants and why?

Music & DT	History
