Mr Russell's Update

Happy new year, we hope you had a good Christmas and new year celebrations. The end of term was an enjoyable one, but also tiring, the holiday came at the right time for all the children and staff. As we move into 2023 we have a couple of changes to staffing.

CLASS 2

Miss Kennard has left the school to take up a full time role closer to home. We wish her well and thank her for all her hard work whilst she was with us at North Duffield. Miss Taylor, who has been working in school for the past year, will be teaching the class on Thursday and Friday each week.

CLASS 4

We are pleased that Mr Stroyd is able to start teaching more, as he continues his recovery from Covid. Along with his current days, he will be adding a half day on Thursday afternoon. Miss Taylor will continue on a Tuesday until he is able to increase his days again and I will be covering Thursday morning this half term. Mr Stroyd and myself are positive about his recovery and hope he will be able to teach more throughout this term.

OFFICE

We have also had a change in the office. Mrs Dennison has left the school for a promotion to school business manager at Wheldrake School. Whilst it is a loss to the school we wish her well in her new job.

At the end of the year we employed Mrs Karbani to fill the role of School Business Manager. She will be working every morning. We have also recruited Mrs Hinchcliffe to form as an Admin Assistant in the office during the afternoon. We welcome them both to North Duffield.

ATTENDANCE

As part of the national attendance agenda, we sent out our procedures to ensure all children attend school regularly. Currently our whole school attendance is 95.06%, slightly below our 96% target. Whilst we are aware of a number of illnesses at the end of term we have a number of children whose attendance is below 90%. The school will contact parents to support and ensure this improves in the spring term.

SCHOOL TIMES

Last term we had a number of children who were late for school. School begins at 9am, gates open at 8:50 to allow time for an orderly entrance to school. We realise, due to unforeseen circumstances, you may be late. We request that if you will be arriving after 9am you let the school know via email or phone call and also let us know what your child is doing for lunch. All our meals are cooked fresh each day and to ensure we can cater and guarantee a school meal, dinners must be ordered no later than 9:30am.

Queen Elizabeth II



We had a very sad start to the Autumn Term with the sudden passing of Queen Elizabeth II. We held a special assembly where the children watched a newsreel of Her Majesty's life and had the opportunity to ask any questions. We observed a minute's silence to commemorate the Queen and some children chose to leave messages of condolence in our memorial garden.

Following this incredibly historic occasion, we allowed our pupils to spend a little time each day following the procession from Balmoral to Westminster and the lying-in-state period. School was closed on Monday 19th September for the state funeral.



Bikeability

Our Year 6 pupils completed their Bikeability cycle training Levels 1 and 2 in September. They learnt about their equipment, how to manoeuvre, signalling and various practical on-road skills. They had to take a written test on general road safety and the Highway Code. We are very proud of them all and hope you see them using their newly gained techniques around the village.



Falconry

Class 1 were visited by SMJ Falconry and their wonderful array of birds of prey. The children met and handled Tawny, Tropical Screech, Long Eared and Barn Owls. They learnt all about these beautiful creatures and thoroughly enjoyed this hands on experience.

Thank you to everyone who attended our Open Evening in October. It was a great success and a wonderful opportunity for us to not only showcase our school to prospective parents, but also give our existing families the chance to see what their children have been learning. We know that many of our newer parents, who missed out on an open day due to lockdown, appreciated being able to explore the classrooms and our other facilities and gain a greater understanding of our curriculum. 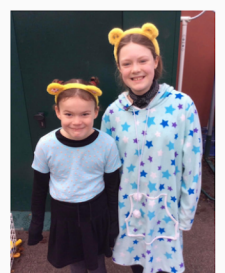
