

Dragons

We are sure most of our pupils and their families have now heard the rumours that we have had a dragon at school! It all started earlier this term, when Class 3 began reading "The Boy Who Grew Dragons" by Andy Shepherd. They then started writing their own stories and haiku poems and creating some amazing art work, the clay dragon eyes were very lifelike. Mrs Duffy then discovered a nest, hidden amongst the trees in Forest School. With their new knowledge of dragons, Class 3 were certain the colourful eggs had been laid by one and reports then started coming in from children all over school of sightings.
