GOVERNOR SPOTLIGHT

Hi, my name is Amanda Harrison and I have just joined the School Governing Body. I am married to Jonathan and we have two children in North Duffield School - Evie (Year 6) and Isaac (Year 3). We have lived in the village for 13 years, and I have always enjoyed getting involved in community activities. I was previously a member of the pre-school committee (North Duffield Under Fives) when my own children were attending the setting, and enjoy being a member of the Friends of school. I have also featured in our Village Pantomime! Now that both my children are in school, the time felt right to apply for a position as a Parent Governor, to be able to be more involved with school life.



Since setting up my own business almost three years ago, I have been able to adopt a much better work-life balance, which has enabled me to devote more time to voluntary work, including fundraising activities with the Friends of North Duffield School, as well as enjoying more time with my children and being able to be there more for them. Being able to devote more time to school, to help create the best possible learning environment for all our children through becoming part of the Governing Body, seemed like a great opportunity for me.
